Public Input Sought on Environmental Analysis on Proposed Changes to City's Wastewater Utility System

The City of Snohomish is proposing to update its General Sewer Plan and Wastewater Facility Plan and its Comprehensive Plan. The purpose of the update is to comply with the Clean Water Act and to meet future water quality and growth requirements.

The proposed action would remove the discharge to the Snohomish River from the City's wastewater treatment plant, and would convey all City wastewater flows to the City of Everett's plant for treatment and discharge. In contrast, under the existing 2005 sewer plan, the City would continue to discharge to the river and would upgrade and operate the City's treatment plant with an on-site sequencing batch reactor and other facilities as described in existing environmental documents. A draft SEPA Addendum has also been prepared which adds analysis and information about the alternatives that were not available in the 2005 plan and SEPA documents.

You are invited to comment on the proposal and the draft SEPA Addendum. The deadline for receiving comments is September 13, 2010. Hill Park Volunteer Project

As you may be aware, this spring the Snohomish Community Church and the “Day of Caring” event banded together to give Hill Park a face lift. This included a new peeled pole fence, entrance and rules signs, driveway re-design and construction, new retaining wall around the lower gazebo, and power to the lower gazebo.

On Monday and Tuesday of this week, Hill Park received another helping hand from Snohomish Community Church. The Church’s volunteer program brings out its youth to donate their time to the community. With Tim Sire and Pastor Gordon Everett at the helm, these volunteers compiled a total of 70 hours of community service to complete this project for the City. The project consisted of finishing the retaining wall to accommodate a large barbeque at the lower shelter, pouring a concrete slab, spreading 20 yards of topsoil, and other odds and ends to complete the Hill Park project.

If you have not been to Hill Park recently you should check it out. They did an excellent job, and the results can now be enjoyed by the entire community.

Something to remember about Hill Park: Hill Park was built by volunteers, “Sportsman Club,” and it is wonderful to see this volunteer tradition continue.
